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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REVIEW REPORT ON THE INTERIM CONDENSED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO THE UNITHOLDERS OF ANB CAPITAL DIGITAL IT & EQUITY FUND (SHARIAH) (MANAGED BY ANB CAPITAL COMPANY)

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed statement of financial position of anb capital Digital IT & Equity Fund (Shariah) (the "Fund") managed by anb capital Company (the "Fund Manager") as at 30 June 2026, and the related interim condensed statement of comprehensive income, interim condensed statement of changes in equity attributable to the unitholders and interim condensed statement of cash flows for the six-month period then ended, and explanatory notes. The Fund Manager is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these interim condensed financial statements in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, "Interim Financial Reporting" ("IAS 34") as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these interim financial statements based on our review.

Scope of Review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity" as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. A review of interim financial statements consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing that are endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed financial statements are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with IAS 34 as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

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NOTES TO THE INTERIM CONDENSED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the six-month period ended 30 June 2026

1. GENERAL

anb capital Digital IT & Equity Fund (Shariah) (the “Fund”) is an open-ended public equity investment fund. The Fund's investment objective is to grow the capital of unitholders by investing exclusively in the shares of digital and technology companies. The Fund was established on 02 Rajab 1445H (corresponding to 14 January 2024) by anb capital Company (the “Fund Manager”) and started its operation on 14 Ramadan 1445H (corresponding to 24 March 2024). The address of the Fund Manager is P.O. Box 220009, Riyadh 11311, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

In accordance with the Capital Market Authority's ("CMA") decision No. 1-83-2005 dated 21 Jumada Awal 1426H (corresponding to 28 June 2005) issued by the CMA Board in connection with the regulations relating to Authorised Persons, the Arab National Bank transferred its asset management operations to the anb capital company ("the Fund Manager"), a wholly owned subsidiary of the Arab National Bank, effective 1 January 2008.

The Fund has appointed AlBilad Investment Company (the “Custodian”) to act as its custodian and registrar. The fees of the custodian and registrar's services are paid by the Fund.

The Fund Manager is responsible for the overall management of the Fund's activities. The Fund Manager can also enter into arrangements with other institutions for the provision of investment, custody or other administrative services on behalf of the Fund.

2. REGULATING AUTHORITY

The Fund is governed by the Investment Funds Regulations (the “Regulations”), issued by the Board of the Capital Market Authority (CMA) pursuant to Resolution No. 1-219-2006 dated 3 Dhul Hijjah 1427H (corresponding to 24 December 2006G), based on the Capital Market Law issued by Royal Decree No. M/30 dated 2 Jumada Al-Thani 1424H, and as amended by the Resolution of the Board of the Capital Market Authority No. 1-135-2025 dated 03 Jumada Al-Akhirah 1447H (corresponding to 24 November 2025).

3. BASIS OF PREPARATION AND CHANGES TO MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

3.1. Basis of preparation

These interim condensed financial statements for the six-month period ended 30 June 2026 have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 “Interim Financial Reporting” (“IAS 34”) as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

The interim condensed financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required in annual financial statements and should, therefore, be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2025. In addition, results for the six-month period ended 30 June 2026 are not necessarily indicative of the results that may be expected for the financial year ending 31 December 2026.

These interim condensed financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis, except for financial assets held at fair value through profit or loss which are stated at their fair value.

These interim condensed financial statements are presented in Saudi Riyals (“**ﷲ**”), which is the functional currency of the Fund.

3. BASIS OF PREPARATION AND CHANGES TO ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

3.2 New standards, interpretations and amendments

3.2.1 New standards and amendments adopted by the Fund

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the interim condensed financial statements are consistent with those followed in the Fund's annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2025, except for the adoption of new standards effective as of 1 January 2026. The Fund has not early adopted any standard, interpretation or amendment that has been issued but is not yet effective.

6. TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES

Related parties are considered to be related if one party has the ability to control the other party or exercise significant influence over the other party in making financial or operational decisions. In considering each possible related party relationship, attention is directed to the substance of the relationship, not merely the legal form.

Related parties of the Fund include the Fund Manager, the Fund Board, other funds managed by the Fund Manager and key employees of the same.

A subscription fee of maximum of 2% may be charged to the subscribers by the Fund Manager upon subscription.

The Fund pays a management fee at the rate of 1.75% per annum calculated based on the total net asset at each valuation date. In addition, the Fund Manager also charges other fees at a maximum rate of 1.00% per annum calculated based on the total net asset value at each valuation date to meet other expenses of the Fund.

The management fees amounting to RM 397,804 (30 June 2025: RM 579,249) and other fees amounting to RM 81,335 (30 June 2025: RM 94,919) which have been presented in the interim condensed statement of comprehensive income and represent the fees charged by the Fund Manager as described above. During the period, the fund recorded Board remuneration expense of RM 3,206 and as at 30 June 2026 a payable of RM 3,206 (30 June 2025: RM 2,131).

The management fees and other fees included under accrued expenses payable to the Fund Manager at the period-end are presented in the interim condensed statement of financial position.

7. FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Fund measures its investments in financial instruments at fair value at each reporting date.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value measurement is based on the presumption that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability takes place either in the principal market for the asset or liability, or in the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market for the asset or liability. The principal or the most advantageous market must be accessible by the Fund. The fair value of an asset or a liability is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming that market participants act in their economic best interest.

The fair value for financial instruments traded in active markets at the reporting date is based on their closing price on the reporting date.

The Fund has only investments at fair value through profit or loss which is measured at fair values. All other financial assets and liabilities are classified as amortized cost and management believes that the fair value of all other financial assets and liabilities at the reporting date approximate their carrying values owing to their short-term tenure and the fact that these are readily liquid. There were no transfers between various levels of fair value hierarchy during the current period.

10. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

There have been no significant subsequent events since the period ended 30 June 2026 that require disclosure or adjustment in these interim condensed financial statements.

However, the geopolitical situation in the Middle East has deteriorated significantly since 28 February 2026. The situation has remained highly volatile and has impacted several countries in the Middle East including Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, causing disruption to some business and economic activities.

The Fund Manager is closely monitoring the situation and has activated its business continuity planning and other risk management practices to manage the potential business disruption on its operations and financial performance due to the geopolitical outbreak.

The Fund Manager has assessed the potential implications of the changes in geopolitical situations on its operations, financial position and performance. Based on information currently available, including the continuation of core business activities, it is not practicable to reliably estimate the full financial effect of the changes in geopolitical situations on the future periods. The Fund Manager has also considered the impact of these situations on the Fund's ability to continue as a going concern and has concluded that the going concern basis of preparation remains appropriate.

11. LAST VALUATION DAY

The last valuation day of the period was 28 June 2026 (2025: 31 December 2025).

12. APPROVAL OF INTERIM CONDENSED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The interim condensed financial statements were approved by the Fund's management on 26 Safar 1448H (corresponding to 09 August 2026).
