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THE INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the unitholders of Albilad SAR Murabaha Fund **Report on Review of Condensed Interim Financial Information**

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed statement of financial position of Albilad SAR Murabaha Fund (the "Fund") managed by Albilad Investment Company (the "fund manager") as at 30 June 2026, and the related interim condensed statements of comprehensive income, changes in equity attributable to the unitholders and cashflows for the six-month period then ended and other explanatory notes ("the interim condensed financial information"). Fund Manager is responsible for the preparation and presentation of this interim condensed financial information in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 Interim Financial Reporting ("IAS 34") as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this condensed interim financial information based on our review.

Scope of Review

We conducted our review in accordance with the International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditors' of the Entity" as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. A review of interim condensed financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed financial information is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with IAS 34 as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

Other Matter

The annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2025 and the interim condensed financial information for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 were reviewed by another auditor who expressed an unqualified audit opinion and unmodified review conclusion on them in their report dated 31 March 2026 and 10 August 2025 respectively.

1 LEGAL STATUS AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

Albilad SAR Murabaha Fund (the “Fund”) is an open-ended investment fund, managed by Albilad Investment Company (the “Fund Manager”), a subsidiary of Bank Albilad (the “Bank”) for the benefit of the Fund’s Unitholders (the “Unitholders”). The objective of the Fund is to protect investor’s principal investment and to achieve reasonable return by way of Murabaha based transactions that do not conflict with Shari’ah rules.

In dealing with the Unitholders, Fund Manager considers the Fund as an independent accounting unit. Accordingly, the Fund Manager prepares separate financial statements for the Fund. Furthermore, the Unitholders are considered to be the beneficial owners of the assets of the Fund.

Riyad Capital is the custodian (the “Custodian”) of the Fund.

The Fund is governed by the Investment Fund Regulations (the “Regulations”) issued by the Board of the Capital Market Authority (CMA) pursuant to its Resolution Number 1 - 219 - 2006 on 3 Dhul Hijja 1427H (corresponding to 24 December 2006) and new amendment number 2-22-2021 by resolution of the Board of the CMA on 12 Rajab 1442H (corresponding to 24 February 2021) effective from 19 Ramadan 1442H (corresponding 1 May 2021) by the New Investment Fund Regulations (“Amended Regulations”) published by the Capital Market Authority on 17 Rajab 1442H (corresponding to 1 March 2021) detailing requirements for all funds within the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. During the period ended 30 June 2025, CMA has issued another amendment to the regulation via amendment number 1-54-2025 issued on 23 Dhul Qidah 1446H (corresponding to 21 May 2025) which is effective from 14 Muharram 1447H (corresponding 9 July 2025).

The registered office of the Fund is Albilad Investment Company, P.O. Box 8162, Riyadh 12313 – 3701, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION

These interim condensed financial statements of the Fund have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 – “Interim Financial Reporting” (IAS 34) as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

These interim condensed financial statements should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2025. In addition, results for the six-month period ended 30 June 2026, are not necessarily indicative of the actual results for the full year ending on 31 December 2026 and final results may differ.

These interim condensed financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost convention using accrual basis of accounting except for the revaluation of investments measured at FVTPL.

The principal accounting policies, estimates and assumptions used in the preparation of these interim condensed financial statements are consistent with those of the previous financial year, i.e. 31 December 2025, except as described in note 3 below.

The Fund does not have a clearly identifiable operating cycle and therefore does not present current and non-current assets and liabilities separately in the interim statement of financial position. Instead, assets and liabilities are presented in order of liquidity. However, all balances would generally be classified as current except for “Investments measured at amortised cost”.

The preparation of these interim condensed financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected. Except for expected credit loss (ECL) against financial assets, there are no areas of significant judgment or critical assumption used in the preparation of these interim condensed financial statements.

In preparing these interim condensed financial statements, the significant judgments made by management in applying the Fund’s accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty including the risk management policies were the same as those that applied to the annual financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2025.

IFRS 18 *Presentation and Disclosure in Financial Statements* ("IFRS 18") will replace IAS 1 *Presentation of Financial Statements* and is effective for annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2027. The Fund has not early adopted IFRS 18 in preparing this condensed interim financial information. Fund manager is in the process of assessing the estimated impact of its initial application on the Fund's financial statements, and its preliminary assessment across the four key areas introduced by the standard is set out below. The assessment may be subject to change as the Fund finalises its transition project ahead of the effective date.

a. Structure of the Statement of Profit or Loss

IFRS 18 requires income and expenses to be classified into five categories — operating, investing, financing, income taxes and discontinued operations — and introduces two new mandatory subtotals: *operating profit or loss* and *profit or loss before financing and income taxes*. Classification is generally driven by an entity's main business activities.

The Fund has determined that its main business activity is investing in money market instruments, sukuk and other eligible financial assets to generate investment returns while preserving capital and providing liquidity. Under IFRS 18, entities whose main business activity is investing in financial assets are required to classify the related income and expenses within the *operating* category, rather than investing. Accordingly, special commission income, dividend income, net fair value gains or losses on investments held at fair value through profit or loss, and related fund operating expenses are expected to continue to be presented within operating profit or loss.

The Fund does not expect the adoption of IFRS 18 to change total comprehensive income or Unitholders' equity. The principal impact is expected to be on the presentation, labelling and subtotals within the statement of profit or loss, rather than on recognition or measurement.

a. Management-defined Performance Measures

Management-defined performance measures ("MPMs") are subtotals of income and expenses, not otherwise specified by IFRS, that are used in public communications outside the financial statements to communicate management's view of an aspect of the Fund's financial performance, and which are required to be reconciled to the most directly comparable IFRS subtotal.

The Fund has reviewed its external communications, including investor reporting and fund fact sheets, and has not identified any performance measures that meet the definition of an MPM under IFRS 18. Accordingly, no MPM reconciliation disclosures are currently expected to be required on adoption. The Fund will continue to monitor its external communications up to the effective date, as any measure introduced in the interim could still meet the definition.

b. Principles of Aggregation and Disaggregation

IFRS 18 introduces enhanced principles for aggregating and disaggregating information in the primary financial statements and notes based on shared or dissimilar characteristics, together with more specific requirements on the labelling and description of line items, and the use of unspecific descriptions such as "other."

The Fund is assessing its statement of financial position, statement of comprehensive income and related notes against these principles. Based on the assessment performed to date, the Fund expects the adoption of IFRS 18 to result in more granular presentation and disclosure of certain line items but does not expect a significant impact on the Fund's financial position or financial performance.

c. Consequential Amendments to IAS 7

IFRS 18 makes consequential amendments to IAS 7 *Statement of Cash Flows*, including removing the choice of classification for interest and dividends received or paid and requiring the statement of cash flows to use operating profit or loss (rather than profit or loss) as the starting point for the indirect method.

The Fund is assessing the impact of these amendments on its statement of cash flows. Given that special commission income and net investment gains and losses already form part of the Fund's principal/operating activities, no significant change to the classification of the Fund's cash flows is currently expected, although the presentation of the reconciliation to operating profit or loss may change.

4 FUNCTIONAL AND PRESENTATION CURRENCY

Items included in the interim condensed financial statements are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Fund operates (the "functional currency"). These interim condensed financial statements are presented in Saudi Riyal ("ﷲ") which is the Fund's functional and presentation currency. All financial information presented in ﷲ has been rounded to the nearest thousand.

7 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND BALANCES

Related parties comprise Fund Manager, Directors, key management personnel and any businesses which are controlled, either directly or indirectly, by the unitholders or over which they exercise significant influence. The Fund enters into transactions in the normal course of business with these parties at prices and terms agreed between the parties.

For management services, the Fund pays a management fee at an annual rate of 0.25% (2025: 0.25%) of the equity value at each Valuation Day of the Fund's equity value.

In the ordinary course of its activities, the Fund transacts business with related parties. Related party transactions are in accordance with the Terms and Conditions of the Fund. All the related party transactions are approved by the Fund Board. Related parties comprise Fund Manager, Bank Albilad (the Parent Company of Fund Manager) and Fund Board.

9 FAIR VALUES OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Fund's financial assets consist of cash and cash equivalents, investments measured at amortised cost and investments measured at FVTPL. The Fund's financial liabilities consist of accrued management fee payable and accruals and other liabilities.

The fair value of financial instruments traded in active markets is based on quoted market prices at the close of trading on the reporting date. Instruments for which no sales were reported on the valuation day are valued at the most recent bid price.

An active market is a market in which transactions for the asset or liability take place with sufficient frequency and volume to provide pricing information on an ongoing basis.

The fair value hierarchy has the following levels:

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9 FAIR VALUES OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS (continued)

- Level 1 inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the entity can access at the measurement date;
- Level 2 inputs are inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly; and
- Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

The estimated fair value of the Fund's financial assets and financial liabilities not carried at fair value, is not considered to be significantly different from their carrying values.
